Reminder About Certification (CERT) Testing:

On May 20th, much of the code needed for the November 1, 2015 mandatory date was deployed to the Certification environment for testing by all trade filers. CBP strongly recommends trade filers work with their Client Reps to test new and existing entry and entry summary capabilities (including entry/entry summary types 01, 03, and 11) via the Certification environment to ensure they are ready well in advance of the November 1, 2015 mandatory date. Implementation Guides are posted to CBP.gov/ACE. See Technical Documentation Guidance above to access this information.

CBP is working to ensure that quota continues to be processed fairly, timely and consistently for all filers in both ACS and ACE as we approach the November milestone for mandatory use of ACE for electronic entries and related entry summaries. To that end, deployment of entry types on which quota merchandise may be filed will occur in conjunction with the October 31, 2015 deployment and includes the following entry types: 02, 06, 07, 12, 21, 22, 23, 31, 32, 34, and 38.

Key Transition Dates

MAY 1, 2015

Mandatory use of ACE for all electronic import and export manifest filings for all modes.

NOVEMBER 1, 2015

Mandatory use of ACE for all electronic cargo release and related entry summary filings.

OCTOBER 1, 2016

Mandatory use of ACE for all remaining electronic portions of the CBP cargo process.
