Subject: End of Declaration of First Sale

This notice is being issued to inform the Trade that the filing period of the First Sale Declaration indicator has ended effective August 19, 2009.

Background

The First Sale Declaration Requirement was established under section 15422(a) in the Food Conservation and Energy Act of 2008, which is commonly referred to as the Farm Bill. The First Sale Declaration indicator was required by this legislation. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) had the responsibility to collect this information and forward it to the U.S. International Trade Commission (USITC), who is conducting a review of the use of "first sale" for U.S. imports during the 12-month period which began August 20, 2008.
